How Versatile is Your Mouth?

Recently I read an article about how Christians are becoming increasingly comfortable with swear words. In that article, the polls show that little separates Christians from non-Christians in the speaking department. Swearing, according to many Christians, is an acceptable sin because "it doesn't really hurt anyone." Swearing is so blasé now that many adults are wishing there were stronger words than swear words because they used them so often that they aren't powerful anymore. They want strong words to express themselves in real times of anger because swear words are too common in their vocabulary.

On the other end of the spectrum, there is remarkable power of the mind when we commit Scripture and Christian music to memory. Many people who are suffering from the power of mental diseases that steal memories remember Scripture and the songs they grew up singing in church. The words and music sank into not just their brains but also into their hearts.

How are we shaping our hearts and minds? What are we filling them with? Many adults talk about memorizing Scripture as children, but why did they stop? Why do we not think it vitally important to keep memorizing Scripture as we age, especially as our challenges increase? Would it not be helpful to have the words of life on the tip of our tongue to sustain us and our loved ones in times of celebration or times or concern?

Why is it easier for us to know how to curse others instead of blessing them? Moses sure had reason to

curse his people--his family--after all the stunts they pulled in the wilderness, yet God provided strength for Moses instead to learn the commandments and the teaching of the Lord in order to teach the people the way of abundant life. If the people would learn and adhere to the Law of the Lord then they would be blessed. God even made a way for his people when they fall short and sin to be made in right relationship with him; a way to fully return to the coverage of his blessing was embodied in Jesus' sacrifice.

Words have the power of life and death, and the effects are visible in our world daily. I believe our words do affect the people around us. David writes in Psalm 19:14, "Let the words of my mouth, and the meditation of my heart, be acceptable in thy sight, O Lord, my strength, and my redeemer." What a powerful prayer to ask the Lord to help us be accountable for our words.

As the priesthood of all believers, we have the ability to speak the priestly blessing over our loved ones. Maybe start your memorizing journey with these verses: "The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you; the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace." These words are from Numbers 6:24-26.

May you be the giver of words of peace and life to all those you meet.




